

Who Evaluates?

- · What's the purpose?
 - How will we use the feedback?
 - Who is best positioned to deliver the message?
- · What are the stakes?
 - · High stakes
 - · Low stakes



What Do You Want to Evaluate?

Process


 What actually happens during implementation of a program – implementation "fidelity"

Outcome

 Looks at what changes because of the results of the program



What are the Evaluation Steps?



Program Description is Always Needed

- What **need** does your program address? What **target groups** need to take action?
- What actions do they need to take?
- What activities are needed to meet intended outcomes?
- What is the **relationship** between activities and intended outcomes?



Program Theory of Change

- Start with the end in mind: what is the ultimate goal of the thing you are doing?
- Start with an overarching goal and then identify what approaches or activities are required to meet that goal.




Note: Program description makes the theory of change $\,$ clear, not true!



Logic Model

 Visual representation of the relationships between your program's activities and its intended outcomes (i.e., what you hope happens as a result of your program)

Using and Sharing Lessons Learned

- Share results and lessons learned with stakeholders and others
- Use findings to modify, strengthen, and improve your program
- Consider information needs of the audience and stakeholders
- Tailor message and format to the users of the evaluation
 - Oral
 - Written (full report, executive summary, etc.)



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Reporting

- Provide an executive summary
- Use examples, graphics, quotes to highlight findings
- Present data simply and concisely
- Use active verbs to **shorten sentences**
- Organize results by evaluation question
- Eliminate redundancies
